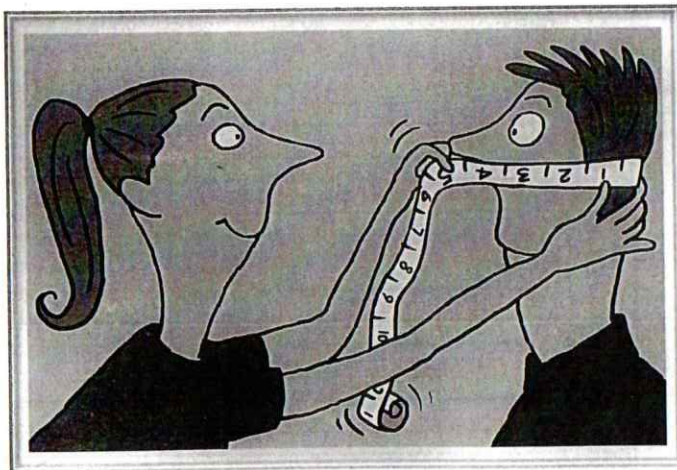
WHAT IS PHYSIOGNOMY?
