The steam engine was invented by James Watt. The telephone is the invention of Alexander Graham Bell. Penicillin was discovered by Alexander Fleming. The television was invented by John Logie Baird. What do all these as well as waterproof coats, rubber tyres, radar, bicycles and many other things have in common? They were all invented or discovered by people born in Scotland. So many amazing people have come from one country that it's not surprising that some inventors are not remembered, even in their home country.

One of these is **Robert William Thomson** who has been forgotten by most people outside his home town of Stonehaven. He was born in 1822 and left school at the age of 14. However, he taught himself chemistry, astronomy, mathematics and electricity and soon became an inventor. In 1845, he invented the rubber tyre although there was little interest at the time as there were no cars and only a few bicycles. Fifteen years after his death, when cars and bicycles had appeared, John Dunlop, another Scotsman, reinvented the rubber tyre and is still famous.

Some people still remember Thomson and, every June in Stonehaven, drivers of old cars meet to honour the man the world has forgotten.
