

# The Beauty and the Beast



Mary Shelley was born Mary Godwin in London in 1797. Both her parents were writers. Unfortunately, her mother died when she was just ten days old.

1\_\_\_\_\_ She didn't get on with her step mother and spent some time with other relatives in Scotland. When she was seventeen, she fell in love. Her father was unhappy with her choice of boyfriend. The man she had fallen in love with was the poet Percy Shelley. Mary and Percy left England in July 1814. They travelled through France to

Switzerland. 2\_\_\_\_\_. They had run out of money in Lucerne. Back in England, their financial situation improved in 1816. Percy's grandfather died and left him some money. 3\_\_\_\_\_. The summer of 1816 was a very wet one so they spent a lot of time at home reading ghost stories. It was at this time that Mary had an idea which changed her life. She started writing her novel in 1816 and it was published in 1818. It was an immediate success although some people called it 'horrible and disgusting'. 4\_\_\_\_\_. The name of the novel? Frankenstein.
